MINUTES FOR JULY 25, 2011

COLUMBUS, KANSAS, CHEROKEE COUNTY

OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK

The Cherokee County Commissioners met July 25, 2011. Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all. Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to approve the minutes for July 18, 2011 as prepared and submitted by County Clerk Crystal Gatewood; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Commissioners Garner, Collins, Hilderbrand, and County Clerk Gatewood signed off on the approved meeting minutes.

EXECUTIVE SESSIONS CALLED BY COMMISSION

Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for five minutes for Attorney/Client Privilege to discuss upcoming litigation with himself, Commissioners Garner and Hilderbrand, and County Counselor Kevin Cure. His motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner, with Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in at 11:45 AM and returned at 11:50 AM.

MOTIONS MADE BY COMMISSION

Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve July 2011 Pay Roll; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins, and Garner voting in favor. Chairman Garner signed off on the documentation.

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to approve July 2011 Accounts Payable with the County Treasurer and County Clerk having conferred that monies were available; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins, and Garner voting in favor. Those signing the documentation were Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand and Collins, and County Clerk Crystal Gatewood.

Commissioner Collins made a motion to move the next regular scheduled meeting for August 1, 2011 to August 4, 2011 at 9:00 AM in the Cherokee County Courthouse due to several commission members' outside conflicts. His motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor.

Commissioner Collins made a motion to amend the agenda and move Betty McBride from 10:30 AM to 10:15 AM; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor.



Commissioner Collins made a motion to amend the agenda and move Mac Young from 11:30 AM to 11:10 AM; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins, and Garner voting in favor.

BUSINESS ON THE AGENDA

Betty McBride and Bob Lark of the Exchange State Bank came before the commission to discuss the lease agreement for the elevator for the courthouse being purchased by the commission. The commission said they would give the paperwork to County Counselor Kevin Cure to draw up and finalize.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Leonard Vanatta and Gene Langerot of the County Lot updated the commission on general road and county maintenance. The County Lot mechanics and operators of the road graders are going to have training on the new road graders within the next few weeks. Leonard also reported that it has been too hot for asphalt to be poured, so they have been mowing and other work is being done early in the morning.

Mac Young of Community Corrections came before the commission with their 2012 Budget and Commissioner Garner signed off on the documents presented.

BUSINESS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Sheriff David Groves came before the commission to give them his monthly report. He reported that the Galena schools have extended their grant and put security cameras in Spring Grove School. Two of his officers graduated from the academy.

Zack Hemphill came before the commission to discuss an area at 30th St. and Lostine Road in the county, where cattle and goats owned by Todd Hale have been getting out in the nearby fields and crops planted there. The commission recommended he contact the County Attorney about what he needed to do next.

Treasurer Juanita Hodgson brought in her July 2011 funds statement which is attached to the minutes. Treasurer Hodgson brought in two transfer forms for one employee change within her office and one employee transferring to her office from the County Attorney's Office. Those signing off on the forms were Commissioners Garner and Collins; Commissioner Hilderbrand did not sign the forms.

Dave Jenkins of Kansas Wildlife and Parks asked the commission for permission to do controlled burning in safe areas in the county. He also said they would have their own water and fire protection. The commission agreed and said to let County Dispatch and local fire departments know when they were doing the controlled burning.



County Counselor Kevin Cure came in and the commission gave him the lease agreement-contract submitted by Exchange State Bank, to draw up and finalize for the elevator purchase. The commission also asked Counselor Cure to look over the Scenic By-Ways Resolution submitted by Representative Gatewood and the Route 66 Committee, for him to read over and bring back on August 4, 2011. The commission also asked him to give the deeds to the Sheriff to finalize and sign and to have the next tax sale done the same way as the previous one.

ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Garner made a motion to adjourn at 12:00 PM; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. The next Cherokee County Commission meeting will be held August 4, 2011 at 9:00 AM in the Cherokee County Courthouse in Columbus, Kansas. The regular scheduled meeting for the commission was moved from August 1, 2011 to August 4, 2011.
